Gospel: John 3:13-17

Jesus said to Nicodemus:

"And no one has ever gone up to heaven except the Son of Man, who came down from heaven.

As Moses lifted up the bronze snake on a pole in the desert, in the same way the Son of Man must be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life. For God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not die but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to be its judge, but to be its saviour."

In this week's Gospel, we hear that God loved the world so much that he sent Jesus, to help bring us closer to him. God sent us his Son, even though he knew that Jesus would be put to death on the cross. God knew that Jesus would rise again three days later. The Importance of Attendance

Every Day Counts!

We believe that **good attendance is the foundation of every child's success**. Each day at school provides opportunities to learn, make friends, and develop important life skills. Even small absences can add up quickly and affect progress.

Why Attendance Matters

- Learning builds step by step Missing just one day can mean gaps in understanding.
- Friendships grow daily Being present helps children feel included and connected.
- Thabits for life Regular attendance builds responsibility and resilience.

Did You Know?

- •Being just 10 minutes late every day adds up to nearly a whole week of school missed over the year.
- •Missing 2 days per month = 20 days a year, almost an entire month of learning lost.

How You Can Help

- •Set a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- •Prepare school bags, uniforms, and lunches the night before.
- •Book medical and dental appointments outside of school hours whenever possible.
- •Do not book trips in term time there are 13 weeks a year where you are able to book holidays and visits to family.
- •Contact the school early if your child is unwell or if you're facing challenges with attendance we're here to support you.
