Catholic Life

Gospel: John 2:13-22 It was almost time for the Passover Festival, so Jesus went to Jerusalem. There in the Temple he found people selling cattle, sheep, and pigeons, and also the moneychangers sitting at their tables. So he made a whip from cords and drove all the animals out of the Temple, both the sheep and the cattle; he overturned the tables of the money changers and scattered their coins; and he ordered those who sold the pigeons, "Take them out of here! Stop making my Father's house a marketplace!" His disciples remembered that the scripture says, "My devotion to your house, O God, burns in me like a fire. "The Jewish authorities came back at him with a question, "What miracle can you perform to show us that you have the right to do this?" Jesus answered, "Tear down this Temple, and in three days I will build it again."" Are you going to build it again in three days?" they asked him. "It has taken forty-six years to build this Temple!" But the temple Jesus was speaking about was his body. So when he was raised from death his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and what Jesus had said.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen



Message for the children: Where do you go or what do you do when you want to spend time with God? Sometimes you might pray at home or at school, with others or alone. But each time we pray, we try not to get distracted. We close our eyes. We stop doing anything else so that we can concentrate on God. When we do this, we are able to pay attention to what God is asking of us. Just like Jesus stood up for what was right, when he saw something he disagreed with in the Temple, we are called to do the same.

The Importance of Attendance

Our school attendance this week has been great!

This is how we ensure children stay well in school:

- 1. Support and monitor handwashing
- Children are reminded to wash hands after using the bathrooms and before eating.
- 2. Encourage 'Catch It, Bin It, Kill It'
- •Catch it: use a tissue to cover your nose and mouth when you cough or sneeze. If there's no tissue, cough or sneeze into your elbow, not your hands
- •Bin it: throw the used tissue straight into a bin
- •Kill it: wash hands with soap and water after coughing, sneezing, or touching used tissues
- We make sure we provide enough tissues and bins around school to support this. 3. Provide good ventilation
- •We open windows and doors whenever possible to let fresh air in (except for fire doors)
 - In colder weather, we open high-level windows instead of low ones or open windows and doors between lessons and at breaktimes

We also have a strict cleaning routine which includes disinfecting door handles, chairs and tables regularly.
